## From the Presentation Childhood Learning Center Director

### For a Great Education, Start Here!

Avoid the late August rush! Enroll your child in early childhood education today. While some programs are only accepting children on a wait list, there are still openings in others. Here is a snapshot of the programs that Presentation Childhood Learning Center will offer for children in 2011-12.

#### Toddler Program:

- My School – Offered for children 18 months – 3 years and not enrolled in preschool. It meets one evening per month during the school year.

#### Preschool Programs:

- Full Day Preschool School Year-Operates Labor Day through the first week of June. Programming features morning preschool and child care for working parents or families seeking all day programming. Care may be contracted for up to 10 hours per day.
- NEW OPTION-Preschool Core-Meets Monday through Friday from 8 am – 3 pm. Preschool Core follows *the school calendar* and operates Labor through Memorial Days. Extended care is available for children on days that Presentation of Mary is not in session. Preschool Core is offered 5 days per week.
- Community Preschool is offered 2 or 3 days per week in the morning or 2 days per week in the afternoon. Curriculum includes all academic areas and has a strong socialization component. Community Preschool follows the school calendar and operates Labor through Memorial Days.
- Reading, Rhymes and Rhythm is a Pre-kindergarten program offered 4 days per week in the morning. RRR features a strong academic component. All curriculum areas are covered. Reading, handwriting and literature are emphasized in this class. RRR follows the school calendar and operates Labor through Memorial Days.
- Full Day Preschool Summer Program-This exceptional program operates with a regular or flex-schedule during June, July and August. Preschool students can come for the whole summer or on an as needed basis. Programming features weekly fieldtrips and excursions.

#### Preschool "Add-On" Options

- Children enrolled in the Community Preschool or Reading Rhymes and Rhythm class may contract for an extension to their regular day in the Full Day Preschool Program. Enrollment for the extension slots is available on August 20 at 12:00 pm. If there is a greater number of children interested in the extension slots, than slots available, enrollment will be offered based on the date that the original application was received.
- Add On's include-Lunch Bunch 11:30 am – 12:45 pm, before school (as early as 6:30 am – start of class), or after school (after class-as late as 6 pm). This add-on may be contracted on a regular scheduled or non-regular schedule.

#### School Age Program Offerings (for kindergarten through 6th grade)

- Kindergarten Plus-is for children enrolled at Presentation of Mary School wishing to obtain a full day of kindergarten. Program options are flexible for your developing kindergartener. These options can change as your child matures or family needs change throughout the year.
- Before or After School Care is available 6:30 am – 8:20 am and 3:00 pm – 6:00 pm. It is available to all students regardless of which school they attend. Transportation to PCLC is arranged privately.

## Social Concerns

**Justice:** The news reports of the recent violent riots in UK are a reminder to each of us that discernment and conflict resolution can reap the fruits of peace and justice without bloodshed. These are signs of true transformation of the heart because the well-being of the enemy is regarded as highly as one’s own. Violence is not on the agenda of people who claim to be disciples of Jesus, and who strive to see in their brothers and sisters the face of God even in the face of conflict and disagreement. Never, in the life of Jesus, do we see him resorting to violence. Never does he “pay back” for the hurt and mistrust inflicted on him. He was always ready to look his adversaries “in the eye” and discern with them the issue at hand. Even in the Old Testament, we see the Hebrew prophets boldly proclaiming that God rejected the prayers and sacrifices of those who ignored justice. Justice means to live in right relationship with others and with the earth. That relationship is not brought about by violence.

“Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall see God. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be filled.”

**Charity:** May an unending shower of blessings be upon all who share their resources with our brothers and sisters in poverty...those who donated funds and food and good clothing this past week. This is one sure way to let one’s light shine and not hide it under a bushel! With school soon to begin, let us be mindful of the fact that children and youth living in poverty appreciate having the tennis shoes and other items which are on the “requirement” list maybe more so than those who always have what is needed.

The one question we may be asked when we meet our Creator is ‘What did you do for your brothers and sisters living in poverty?’ Thus spoke Archbishop Samuel Ruiz Garcia who died this past January after spending his life as a priest and bishop for the welfare of the most marginalized people in New Mexico.

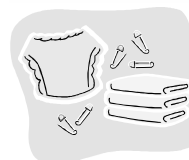
### RAMSEY CARE CENTER WEEKLY COMMUNION SERVICE:
